The suggested program presumes that 62 hours of pre-admission requirements and nine hours of free electives have been earned. Your totals may be more or less.

The Operations (OPS) concentration provides students with management skills for planning, coordinating, and controlling the people and machinery used to transform raw materials into goods and services. Students with this concentration are well prepared to contribute to economic development and competitiveness in New Mexico and the U.S. by taking advantage of excellent career opportunities in inventory planning, purchasing, supply chain management, production control and scheduling, and material resource planning in a wide variety of production, retail and service industries. These include manufacturing, banking, insurance, hospitals, tourism, and construction.

A concentration in Operations Management requires completion of MGMT 434 plus four courses from the following: MGMT 433, 462, 486, 488, ME 356, CS 452. Other Anderson School courses or courses outside of Anderson may be substituted with faculty advisor prior written consent.

NOTES/RECOMMENDATIONS

MGMT 300 is a prerequisite for all upper-division OPS courses. It should be taken as early as possible to avoid later course sequencing problems.

You are your own best advisor. You should know the requirements for graduation and how you are going to fulfill them. The OPS faculty and Anderson advisors are available to assist you in planning your curriculum. You should seek advice prior to making important decisions.

The OPS concentration electives are only offered once a year (and never in the summer), so plan your curriculum carefully, register early, and pay your fees on time.

The areas of Marketing and Operations Management have created an interdisciplinary program. Students may pursue a dual concentration in Marketing and OPS by taking as few as 21 credit hours including MGMT 433, 434, 480, 481, 486, 488, and one additional OPS elective.

Students wishing to use non-pre-approved classes as OPS electives must get permission to do so prior to taking the class.

Register for concentration electives throughout your degree program; not all concentration electives are offered every semester.
